

CCS and Junior Achievement of East Tennessee

Clinton City Schools has a long-standing relationship with Junior Achievement of East Tennessee. These programs are designed to help prepare students in the areas of financial literacy and economics. With the support of many community members and the City of Clinton, Junior Achievement Activities continue to grow across our school system.

Each year, all grade levels (K-6) participate in five Junior Achievement classroom sessions led by community volunteers.

<u>Kindergarten</u>: Introduce importance of saving through storybook characters.

<u>**1**st grade</u>: Family members' jobs and businesses contribute to the well-being of the family.

<u>**2**</u>nd **grade:** Practical information about businesses and occupations.

3rd and 4th grade: Money management and



how entrepreneurs use resources to produce goods and services in a community.

<u>6</u>th grade: Preparing for the working world and explore careers.

Students in 5th grade enjoy a full day experience through **JA Biz Town**. This program combines in-class learning with their visit to a fully-interactive simulated town. "Biz -Town" is located in The Hollingsworth Center for Entrepreneurial Leadership. Students apply for jobs, operate banks, manage restaurants, write checks, and even vote for mayor of JA Biz Town. Students are




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immersed in real world activities in an effort to connect what they learn in school to what they will do as adults.

We added a new component to our collaboration with Junior Achievement this year. **JA Biz Town Summer Venture Camp** ran from June 26-30. Forty-two rising 4th-6th grade students from Clinton City Schools participated in this free event. During this week, campers took a look at what is important in a community. They designed a blueprint of their ideal city and determined the leadership that would be needed to be successful. Each camper decided what position they were interested in and applied, as well as interviewed, for the job. On day two, campers designed a business plan



including budgets and financial obligations. They explored ways to get what they needed in order to open their business and get ready for customers. As they opened their businesses, they learned how to manage their money and use checking and savings accounts. On the fifth



and final day, campers wrapped up the week by creating logos, producing product mock-ups (or service descriptions), and presenting their business ideas in a town meeting. Parents were invited to attend this final event.

Clinton City Schools partnership with Junior Achievement allows our students to participate in experiences that will help them be successful in society. This program helps us meet our goal of developing a well-rounded student. It is also a wonderful way for community members to become involved in the classroom! 
3-D Printing Enhances Learning at CES!

STEM is a large focus in Clinton Elementary's sixth grade program. This year, students were welcomed into sixth grade with two new 3-D printers in Mrs. O'Dell's



room; an exceptional teacher of social studies and science. This year, students will be applying their math skills experimenting with Science concepts to


develop a deep understanding of standards.



To get students oriented to the 3-D printers, students worked with a computer imaging program to create a figure. Once their idea was completed on the computer program, they used the 3-D

printer to bring their vision into life!

The 3-D printers also allow Mrs. O'Dell to create models for teaching science concepts. Early in the year, she created a 3-D skull model from the printer. If she purchased a similar product from an educational company, it would have cost approximately \$50.00. However, her 3-D model was created for only a few



dollars! The printers have advanced tremendously over the past few years. The level of detail in the sculptures is amazing!



Students will be utilizing the printers throughout the year as science and math concepts are explored. If you want to see engaged and excited students, who regularly practice critical, analytical, and creative thinking, come see us! The 3-D printers are just one tool that we use to deepen the learning of our students!
